President’s Report for the Annual General Meeting
Saturday, 24 May 2025**

I present this report as President of the New Zealand Chinese Association (NZCA) Waikato Branch, while concurrently serving as the National President of NZCA. The past year has been marked by significant achievements and collaborative efforts that have strengthened our community both regionally and nationally.

Waikato Branch Highlights

1. (Voice) Engagement and Cultural Celebrations

Chinese New Year 2025: In February, we hosted the Lunar New Year celebrations at our hall, extending invitations to council representatives, including the Mayor and Councillors, to express our gratitude for the new 15-year hall lease. The event featured a traditional "salad toss," symbolizing prosperity for all attendees.

Golden Age Celebration: Also in February, we honored our senior members, acknowledging their invaluable contributions to the community.

Engagement with TANI: In August 2024, we met with The Asian Network Incorporated (TANI) to explore collaborative opportunities aimed at supporting the Asian community within the Waikato region.

2. (Sustainability) Initiatives

NZCA National Academic Awards: Continuing our commitment to education, I chaired the NZCA National Academic Awards. Notably, Waikato's own Alexander Mayo received a well-deserved scholarship in 2024. The awards process was streamlined through a digital application system, encouraging greater youth participation.

3. Cultural (Heritage) Preservation

Mid-Autumn Festival: In September 2024, we celebrated the Mid-Autumn Festival with a Mooncake High Tea with community members, emphasizing cultural heritage and unity.

Manaaki Village Event: Also in September, we collaborated with the China Friendship Society to promote cultural exchange through the Manaaki Village event.

4. (Community) Activities

Culinary Exploration Trip: In October 2024, we organized a "Foodies Train Trip" to Auckland, fostering camaraderie among members through a shared culinary experience.

End-of-Year Lunch : In December 2024, our community celebrated the end of year with Secret Santa and festive activities

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

National Contributions

1. Leadership and Representation (Voice)

National Presidency (Voice): In June 2024, I was elected as the National President of NZCA, succeeding Jenny Too.

New Zealand China Council: (Voice) In August 2024, I was appointed as an ex officio member, facilitating stronger bilateral relations.

MBIE's RGB Group: (Voice) In July 2024, I participated in discussions aimed at enhancing government engagement with ethnic communities, particularly concerning immigration and visitor initiatives, including visa and resident applications.

2. Cultural and Community Engagement

'Fortune' Exhibition (Heritage): In August 2024, I attended the opening of Bev Moon's 'Fortune' exhibition, honoring Chinese heritage.

Asia Wellbeing Summit: (community) Also in August, I engaged in dialogues addressing mental health within Asian communities.

Lunar New Year at Parliament: (Voice) In February 2025, I addressed guests, including the Prime Minister, celebrating cultural diversity.

Chinese Embassy New Year Function (Voice): Also in February, I participated in festivities aimed at strengthening diplomatic ties.

Easter Tournament:(Sustainability) In April 2025, I delivered the opening and closing addresses in Otago and assisted in organizing the first E-Bike social event.

Youth Development Programs: (Sustainability) My support for the NZCA Youth Leadership Camp (YLC) and Leadership Development Camp (LDC) remains unwavering. I attended both camps in January and February 2025, welcoming delegates and promoting leadership skills and cultural awareness among young Chinese New Zealanders.

3. Strategic Meetings and Collaborations

National Executive Meetings: (Community) I chaired sessions in August and November 2024, and March 2025, steering NZCA's strategic direction.

Meeting with Race Relations Commissioner: (Community) In April 2025, I engaged in discussions with Dr. Melissa Derby on promoting racial harmony and understanding. She has been invited as a guest speaker at our upcoming conference in July.

Meetings with Chinese Officials: (Heritage) In April 2025, I met with Chinese Foreign Affairs Minister Madam Chen to discuss bilateral relations and community welfare. Subsequently, in May 2025, I met with Chinese Ambassador Dr. Wang to strengthen diplomatic relationships and community support.

4. Upcoming Initiatives

National Conference: (Community & Sustainability)) I am leading preparations for the NZCA National Conference scheduled for July 2025, aiming to unite members nationwide under the theme of self-care and well-being within our community.


PAST EVENTS
